## Program Director's Notes.....

I was home visiting family a few weeks ago and my mother asked me if I would go do some wood turning on the lathe. "Of course," I replied, receiving anticipatory joy at the thought of Mom's pleasure when I finished creating the item for which she had a need. "What do you need? Maybe a new garden dibble or possibly a rolling pin or a vase? Dad has persimmon, hickory, maple, a little bit of walnut and some white oak out in the shop. What would you like?" "Oh, I don't care," my mother replied. "I need about six bags of shavings for the flower beds."

I hope everyone had a productive summer making shavings, and maybe even completing a project or two. We've got a full lineup of programs for fall, including hands-on programs and live demos from visiting turners. The fall lineup includes:

October 10<sup>th</sup>, general meeting

**Chris Ramsey** – Demonstrating a turned cowboy hat. Raffle tickets can be purchased at the beginning of the meeting and the winner will receive the custom-fit hat. The completed hat is *thin*, weighing only seven to nine ounces when finished. Ramsey is a versatile turner, equally proficient with hollow forms, spindle and combination turning. He particularly enjoys creating both a wide variety of wooden hat sculptures as well as natural-edge pedestal and legged bowls. He prides himself on being able to turn to a mere 3/32" throughout. Chris currently resides in Kentucky. He will bring his own OneWay Lathe for the demonstration.

November 14<sup>th</sup>, general meeting

**Sharpening Tools and Techniques** – Bring a tool and plenty of questions for this multi-station interactive demo. We'll have six to ten different grinders, jigs, and other sharpening tools set up for you to see and try. Bring a tool and have it profiled or sharpened, learn why we put certain grinds on certain tools, and we'll show you how to maintain that profile and sharpness. We'll also demonstrate sharpening techniques beyond your simple bench grinder, including the new "Jool-tool" and the new Jet Wet Stone grinder.

December 12<sup>th</sup>, general meeting

**Jamie Donaldson – Photographing your work** – Jamie Donaldson, a retired professional photographer of 39 years, will give you tips and pointers on photographing your turned work. Stay tuned for more details.

Ron Damon will host another session of woodturning fundamentals focusing on topics discussed in the September session.

### Projector Fund:

Many of you will remember Jimmy Clewes' demo in June. We were able to borrow a fantastic 3000-lumen LCD Projector that allowed everyone in the room at OSU to see the demonstration "bigger than life". The steering committee feels that this would be an incredible asset to the club. It will greatly improve the demo experience for everyone. To support this, we're setting aside a "projector fund" and asking for your support and tax-deductible donation (see Craig Wright, treasurer, for a tax receipt.) During the next few months, we'll have raffles and fundraisers for this worthwhile cause. We estimate the total cost for a 3000-lumen projector (the minimum for showing in a lighted space) and a screen to be around \$1500 or less.

Bowls, hollow forms, spindles, small objects, pens, boxes, platters, segmented, mounting, and tool use.

*What do you think of show and tell? (Top five answers)*

Bring back the blue dot; it's my favorite part of the meeting; it's too slow; needs more critique; needs less critique. (*More critique and less critique* received the same number of responses, ironically).

The steering committee looked over every single survey. After reading just a few, we started to see a definite pattern. In response, we've engineered this year's program around your responses. We've started a Woodturning Fundamentals Program to get newer turners started off on the right foot. We're streamlining the business meeting, and bringing the blue dot back to show and tell. We're having a program devoted entirely to sharpening. Thanks for your responses and for helping us to deliver more of what you want!
