



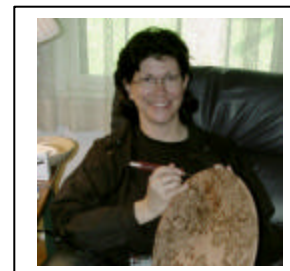

Notes from the president

Another month has come and gone, and time keeps flying by faster and faster. We have a lot of great activities coming up for the club in the next couple of months. Our March meeting will feature a presentation by J.R. Beall, who is helping the club with our collaborative challenge project. We saw the prototypes for the wooden clock we are presenting at the AAW symposium at last month's meeting. The clock face that Jean Hock is working on will be stunning, and all the bits and pieces presented during our show and tell segment are looking great. There's always room for more club members who would like to participate in this project, so please come to the March meeting to learn more about how you can become involved. We will also be having a beginner's corner during the March meeting. Ron Damon and Fred Dutton will present a program on how to make tool handles and tools.



Looking ahead to April, we will have our first ever club swap meet. Now is the time to start cleaning up your shop and finding those seldom-used treasures. I've sure been eyeing the nooks and crannies in my shop trying to think of whom in our club might benefit from this or that unused tool.

We will also be hosting Bonnie Klein for a visit over the weekend of April 23rd. Bonnie is a world-class turner and teacher. Her specialty is small objects such as tops and boxes with threaded lids. She uses a miniature lathe and threading jig of her own design, and she is also an expert with an ornamental lathe. In addition to the all-day demo at Woodwerks, she will offer three days of hands-on classes. The registration forms for these sessions are in this edition of the newsletter and available at the club meeting.

I'd also like to bring to your attention two of the symposia that will be taking place over the next few months. The Utah symposium will take place June 16-18 in Provo, and the AAW symposium July 22-24 in Overland Park, KS. Both of these events are well-worth attending. Some of the featured demonstrators at Utah this year include Richard Raffan, Ray Key, Neil Scobie, Malcolm Tibbets, Dale Nish, and Kip Christensen, to name a few. Demonstrators for the AAW symposium include Jean-Francois Escoulen, Phil Irons, John Jordan, Andre Martel, Nick Cook, Bob Rosand, Don Derry, Art Liestman, a dozen others, and yours truly. These symposia are truly wonderful opportunities for learning new techniques, seeing amazing work in the instant galleries, and for fellowship with fellow turners. Registration for the Utah symposium is limited to about 400 attendees, and fills up fast. There are usually about 1000 turners in attendance at the AAW symposium. 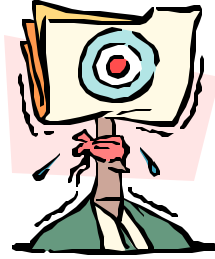

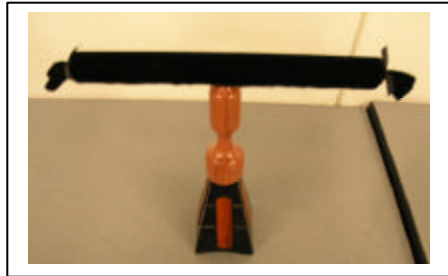

AAW Educational Opportunity Grants

Did you know that the American Association of Woodturners has allocated \$30,000 annually for grants to be awarded to individual members or local chapters? Some of the questions you may now be asking yourself are:

- Why are they doing this?
- Who is eligible for these grants?
- How do I apply?

“Purpose of the Program

- To allow *AAW members to benefit* from their own Fundraising efforts and generous support.
- To provide *educational opportunities* that expand and enrich the entire woodturning community
- To *provide ways that these skills may be shared* with local chapters, seminars, schools, and friends.
- To *create opportunities for members* who would otherwise not be financially able.
- To *create a full-circle relationship*, of AAW working for and with its members and chapters.

Eligibility

- An *individual applicant* must be an AAW member in good standing and must not have received an AAW grant in the previous five years. Recipients must submit a report on their experiences within six months of their completion for possible inclusion in the Journal.
- A *local chapter applicant* must be affiliated with the AAW and not have won a grant in the previous 12-month period. A report should be submitted for the Journal.

Bonnie's Classes

Worried that you don't know what you're getting into when you sign up for one of the club-sponsored classes? You needn't be – read on for the basic skills. And remember the classes are small and you know all the other students! Kind of like being on the winning team!!

CLASS 1 (One day class) (more of a basic class)

An important part of turning is to develop a technique that will produce the best possible finish from the tool - thus reducing the amount of sanding necessary. During the class, cutting theory, tool usage, and tool sharpening and shaping techniques will be demonstrated and discussed. With a good understanding of cutting theory and tool usage, this is within reach of the beginning turner as well as the more advanced turner. The students will be guided through some basics and then turn several projects good for skill building or production. The use of chatterwork and color will be part of the class.

CLASS 2 (Two day class) Turning Boxes with Threaded Lids

Bonnie specializes in boxes with threaded lids and has been the pioneer in this field for many years. She designed a threading jig to fit the Klein lathe, but it may also be used on other lathes. In this class we will concentrate on designing and turning boxes with threaded lids. Students will have an opportunity to use various materials for inserts and to turn acrylic. Chatterwork as well as other decorative surface treatments will be explored. Bonnie will share with you her techniques and enthusiasm for turning threaded boxes. Students should have some box making experience.

Club By-Laws

The Steering Committee has proposed an amendment to the Code of Regulations (by-laws) of the Central Ohio Woodturners. We expect to conduct a formal vote to approve this amendment at the April 2005 meeting. The proposed amendment adds article 7 to the document. The new article is:

ARTICLE VII: APPOINTED OFFICERS

- 7.1 PROGRAM DIRECTOR:** The Program Director shall be responsible for arranging the guest speakers, demonstrators, etc. at each general monthly meeting. The President shall appoint the Program Director with approval of the Board of Trustees.
- 7.2 NEWSLETTER EDITOR:** The Newsletter Editor shall be responsible for the creation and distribution of the organization's newsletter. A newsletter shall be published monthly (or as designated by the Board of Trustees) and distributed to the membership in a manner designated by the Board of Trustees. The President shall appoint the Newsletter Editor with approval of the Board of Trustees.
- 7.3 WEBMASTER:** The Webmaster shall be responsible for creating and maintaining a website for the organization. The President shall appoint the Webmaster with approval of the Board of Trustees.

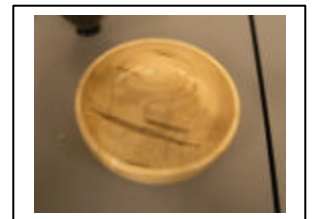
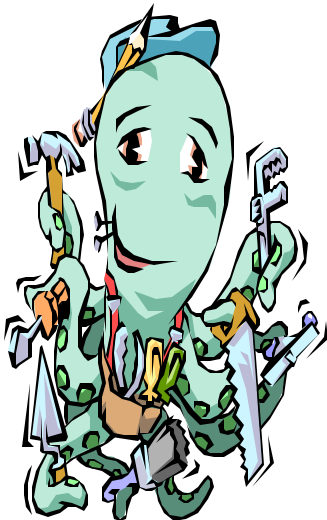
