Help!

Dan Dapra has been a great text editor for *Many Good Turns*, but he will no longer be able to do this most critical function after the May issue. That leaves your layout editor (me) hanging out there with no information to send out to all of you. COW really needs someone to step up to do this job. It takes only a few hours each month and can be done in the comfort of your own home with your own computer.

The job has four aspects:

First, the text editor often needs to remind officers and other regular contributors that the deadline is approaching or past and that their information or reports are needed as soon as possible. This is usually done using email.

Second, the text editor checks the submitted text for typos and obvious grammatical errors. In addition, he or she compares the information from all of the contributors and removes the redundancies that creep in when several people are writing independently about the same events.

Third, the text editor checks on little details in word processing like our standard use of Arial for headings and Times New Roman for text.

Fourth and last, the text editor attaches the various text files to an email message to me so that I can place all the text into the layout of *Many Good Turns*.

I'm sure just the right COW member is reading this and will join the friendly crew getting this publication to you.

If you are unable to attend at the last minute as the result of a personal or family emergency, refunds will be given if another turner is able to fill your spot or to the extent the club has funds to cover the reimbursement. Please remember that the guest turners have to be paid their full fee regardless of individual cancellations. There have actually been situations where the club did not have extra funds to absorb the loss.

The Tuesday meeting in May will be a busy event. We will have the election of officers as well as our annual tool and wood swap. The demo that evening will be a presentation by Dave Bowers of his turning and carving techniques. Dave has been invited to be a guest presenter at the AAW national symposium in Portland, Oregon. This will be a test drive of the presentation he will be giving in July. Congratulations, Dave, on being selected to demonstrate for this prestigious event. The beginners' corner will feature bowl turning and cutting blanks from a rough log.

It is not too early to begin planning for open shop visits this summer. If you would like to open your shop to fellow COWs over the summer, please let one of us know. These visits could be on a weekend or weekday evening. You need not provide a formal demo. Most folks just throw a dead tree on the lathe and everyone plays with a favorite tool or technique.

- The Central Ohio Woodturners has collected \$72,397.18 and spent \$65,649.07 since its founding in 1996.
- Since I became treasurer in March 2002, I have collected over \$60,000 in income and paid expenses of just over \$55,000.
